## BRIGHT CHRISTMAS

Here's how to make these cheery 3D stars:

- 1. Cut a star shape from festive paper.
- 2. Using a ruler as a straight edge, score the star with a bone folder, starting from the center and working out to the points.

3. Fold and crease each scored line. Holly jolly hint: For sturdier stars, layer the paper over cardstock.



DECK

Hang a little holiday happiness with a star-covered chipboard wreath! We first covered the wreath with coordinating paper and then added the stars. Then we glued our paper-covered chipboard "merry" onto candy cane-colored baker's twine and adhered it to the back of the wreath.

## WE WISH YOU A CRAFTY CHRISTMAS

To make this drop-style ornament, start with strips of double-sided paper (with cardstock in between)—two 10", two 8 ½", two 7", and one 6 ½". Line them up in this order: 10", 8 ½", 7", 6", 7", 8 ½", 10". Fold a square of paper over one end, poke holes, and tie on twine for hanging. Repeat for the other end.

## HORAE FOR THE HOLIDAYS

A faux-naturel forest will certainly earn you a spot on the nice list this year. Holly tree: Cover foam tree with paper. Cut holly shapes from coordinating paper, and pin to tree. Loop tree: Cover foam tree with paper. Sandwich cardstock between patterned paper, and cut into strips. Form strips into loops, and pin to tree.
